Our Simplicity:

Our Disclaimer:

Our Uniqueness:

Relationships—Scripture has much to say about relationships. In fact, when asked to pick the greatest commandment from the Hebrew Bible, Jesus responded with two

commands concerning relationships, one between the individual and God and the other between the individual and other human beings.

And He said to him, “You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.” This is the great and foremost commandment. The second is like it, “You shall love your neighbor as yourself.”
Matthew 22:36-39

We believe that Jesus was expressing the foundation of a life that is pleasing to God. In our desire to please God as a church, we have chosen to place heavy emphasis on the cultivation of healthy relationships with God and others.

Discipleship—Jesus, the Son of God, prescribed the discipleship process as the heart of the mission for His church (Mark 16:15; Matthew 28:18-20). Jesus did not prescribe a discipleship program, but a way of life. We believe that training and teaching are important in the development of a believer, but that obedience, which is the proof of being a true follower of Christ, flows out of the believer’s love for God.
